AARON T. ROBERTS TO BE SWORN IN ON MAY 24TH

Kansas City, Kansas Municipal Court Judge Aaron T. Roberts will be sworn in as the newest District Court Judge for the 29th Judicial District on May 24, 2013 at 3:30 p.m. in Division 9 of the Wyandotte County District Court.

Judge Roberts was born in Kansas City, Kansas to Tom and Janet Roberts. He has one brother, Brian, who is a Kansas City, Kansas police officer. After graduating from Bishop Ward High School in 1996, Roberts attended the University of Kansas where he obtained his undergraduate degree in 2000 and his law degree in 2003.

Upon graduation, Roberts began working for the Unified Government Legal Department primarily handling tax appeal and tax collection cases. In 2007, he moved to the City Prosecutor's Office where he prosecuted traffic violations, misdemeanor offenses and municipal code violations. And in November, 2008, he was appointed to an open position as a Municipal Court Judge.

Roberts and his wife Carol were marred in 2005, and have two children; Madeline, 6, and Thomas, 3. Carol is an elementary school teacher currently on hiatus as a stay at home mom. The family attends St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Kansas City, Kansas where Madeline just finished kindergarten.

Judge Roberts will be assigned to Division 13 where he will primarily hear limited actions cases, traffic violations, DUIs and preliminary hearings in felony criminal cases.

"It is an honor to be appointed to the Wyandotte County District Court," Roberts said. "I promise to continue the Court's longstanding tradition of high ethical standards and humble public service.


