General Procedures

The Kansas Supreme Court is our state's court of last resort. During the special session the Court will hear oral arguments in give cases which have come before the Court. An oral argument is a discussion of the facts and the law involved in the case on appeal. Attorneys on both sides of the appeal are limited to 15 minutes each to present their arguments unless the Court grants additional time. The side challenging the lower court decision, the appellant, presents its argument first, with an opportunity to reserve a portion of the allotted time for rebuttal. The side prevailing in the lower court, the appellee, presents its argument in one block of time.

The attorneys scheduled to argue are seated at the tables to the left and right of the podium. The appellant sits to the left and the appellee to the right. When they present their arguments, the attorneys speak from behind the podium. Each attorney's time is monitored by the Chief Justice, and arguments are stopped at the conclusion of the allotted time unless justices have additional questions. The attorneys may be interrupted from time to time during their arguments by questions from the justices. The purposes of the questions is to clarify the issues for the Court's later discussions in conference.

The Supreme Court sits en banc (with all seven members together) for a week-long period to hear arguments in the cases before them. The Court ordinarily sits in its courtroom in the Kansas Judicial Center in Topeka but has arranged this special session in Kansas City in an effort to make the Court's proceedings Accessible to more people. The procedures followed are typical of any court week.

The justices enter the courtroom from a door on the left and take their positions on the bench. All rise when the bailiff announces the Court's entrance. The Chief Justice enters first and is followed by the rest of the Court by seniority. The justices also sit at the bench in a place designated by seniority. The Chief Justice sits in the middle and the remaining justices alternate to the left and right, with the newest justice sitting on the far right as you face the bench.

The Court announces its decisions by filing them with the Office of the Clerk of the Appellate Courts. Copies are made public and appear at www.kscourts.org.

You may enter or exit the courtroom at any time during the arguments. Please do so as quietly as possible and refrain from talking in the corridor immediately adjacent to the courtroom.
